But this is not just a formal proposal. And in no case has it been the result of a couple of weeks of political reflection, a calculation of opportunities, or a city "branding" strategy.

Everything you will read from here to the last word. It is the result of hard work, of many complicities, of a determined and stubborn commitment to some priorities and not others and striving for the transformation of the city by applying certain values. It has been constant and tenacious work, often not very visible, of many people convinced of the utopia they are striving for.

This text is steeped in dreams and desires. It is full of intentions but also of commitments. The result of work that started a long time ago. From a mature city project.

It is written with great enthusiasm but with its feet on the ground. Fully aware of who we are, what we represent, what we can offer and how we can do it.

The words that follow will, hopefully, precisely explain all of this:

The spaces that will host the Congress so that it can be held in maximum comfort and in a friendly, welcoming environment with the necessary technology.

The sustainability model of the Congress.

Communications with the city and its hotel offer.

And all the other requirements established in the rules.

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You will also read about the city's experience in organising national and international events and the characteristics of a city that for many years has been calling itself: "GRANOLLERS, OPEN TOWN, EDUCATING CITY".

And we hope that the words in each section will also reveal the emotions accompanying them, and that you will be able to perceive them. Words that we write conveying the desire of many citizens of Granollers who have placed their confidence in us.

It is the fruit, the product of long work, of many join projects, of a determined and tenatious commitment to certain priorities and not others, and of a view towards the transformation of the city based on certain values.

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Let's put words to their dreams. The dreams of a small city. As small as most of the members of our International Association of Educating Cities. We believe that it is good and healthy for any organization to know and care for the diversity of its members. And we think, allow us the audacity, that Granollers can, modestly, represent this majority.

We know that if this proposal were to win the confidence of the Executive Committee, we would be the first "small" city to organize



an International Congress. It may seem presumptuous, an act of courage, perhaps a chimaera. However, we must say that we are doing this for the following reasons:

Because we have a long and fully proven history of work, commitment and responsibility in the Association.

Because we assume the responsibilities derived from it, and we have the support of other administrations that share the project, the will and the ideas as well as wanting to share the necessary resources to make it possible.

Because we have a proposal for a theme, axes and contents that address some of the most significant challenges facing our cities. And because these questions, these challenges are being worked on in a thematic network of the RECE (Spanish network) that we coordinate and in which 32 other cities in the country participate.

Because the theme for the Congress and the contents that we propose have been worked on with a scientific team made up of people of great intellectual value and academic recognition who are at the same time closely linked to the Educating Cities movement. Because we feel spurred by the whole city, which is telling us we are ready, that the time has come.

Because we are sure that with the experience accumulated, WE CAN DO IT WELL, AND WE WILL DO IT WELL.

Because diversity counts. And maybe NOW is the time for a small city to host the 2026 International Congress of Educating Cities.

And because we are a city that belongs to the RECE, the Spanish Network of Educating Cities, the most numerous in the AICE. But despite being the most numerous, it has only organized one International Congress, specifically the 13th, in 2014 in Barcelona. And we think the question of alternation and representativeness also needs to be considered. Perhaps now is the time.

In Granollers we want to organise a congress with SOUL.

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In Granollers, we wish to organise a congress with a SOUL. And we want to do it, as always, with the city's inhabitants. In fact, and as we have mentioned, we are already doing it because in the preparation of this dossier, as you will see, citizens from all the city neighbourhoods, various cultural communities, and several generations are collaborating. All eager to contribute to the success of this candidature.

And, of course, we also have the entire municipal organisation that transversally addresses the different areas promoted by this candidacy. It is with their knowledge and skill that we have written some of these pages. As you read, you will find some objectives that are repeated in each section and constitute the model on which we build the entire proposal:

The desire to create well-thought-out spaces to make the meeting a pleasant one.

A model of dialogue with participants that goes beyond the exclusive days the Congress is to be held (proposed for May 2026) and extends to the months before and after. We would like guests to come thoughtfully and full of questions.

A desire to especially promote the participation of young people and children.


A concern to rigorously address relevant aspects of the life of our cities and their future, in the contents we propose.

HISTORY AS AN EDUCATING CITY

This goes back a long way

01 HISTORY AS AN EDUCATING CITY

For a long time, many people have been building a city model where the educational process is totally relevant. Together, they have generated a culture, a trustworthy way of doing things. The point of view of an educating city is present today in practically all political, social, cultural, and economic spheres of the city and, naturally, in the design of its public spaces. And this point of view is the heritage of the whole city.

This city strategy focused on education manifested itself in a rich and diverse network of institutions of all kinds. In most cases, the educational function was their main reason to be.

In 1973, Edgar Faure, in the UNESCO report: "Learning to be" conceptualised the idea of an educating city. Like many others, our city had already created entities, associations and projects that worked in this direction, following this idea.

Thus the Asociación Coral Amics de la Unió was founded in 1877. This association was born not only to entertain young people, but also with a deep educational vocation. Faced with the need for well-trained technical personnel, a group of businessmen from the city created the Escola Municipal de Treball, a vocational training school.

The Agrupació Excursionista was created. Its founders understood the organitation as a space for knowledge, for science, for scientific research, for the esteem of the territory and the knowledge of its traditions and customs.

The Municipal School of Music, the embryo of today's Conservatory, was also created in 1928.

As for the trajectory of Granollers within the movement of educating cities, it must be said that it starts at the very beginning.

From 2007 to 2011 we coordinated the thematic network: "Educating City and Culture of Peace" of the Spanish network.

In 2007 we were chosen by the Assembly of the Spanish Network (RECE) to coordinate it and to host the ninth meeting to be held in 2009. e

In 1994, when the International Association was created, Granollers formalised its adhesion as an active and responsible member.

Since then, Granollers has actively participated in international congresses, national meetings, and also in various networks of the national Spanish network. In 2008 we were elected at the Sao Paulo Congress as members of the Executive Committee. And we have been renewing the confidence of this Assembly successively in 2012, 2016 and 2022.

In 2017 Granollers hosted the Assembly of the Association. Representatives from 75 cities from 12 different countries participated.

ASSEMBLY of the INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF EDUCATING CITIES

The General Assembly of Educating Cities was held on March 23 and 24, 2017, in the Teatre Auditori de Granollers, which brought 57 cities from 15 countries to Granollers. The representatives of the municipalities were able to choose different itineraries to learn about educational experiences in Granollers: One route to see the work of recovering historical memory; a visit to the neighbourhood of Sota el Camino Ral with the help of the neighbours themselves; the expression of urban art in murals in the city; and the knowledge of projects and entities linked to popular and traditional culture. These itineraries were highly appreciated by the attendees, who also participated in the dialogues and conferences. The dialogue between Emilia Sáiz, Deputy Secretary General of the UCLG, and the Mayor of Granollers, Josep Mayoral, defended the role of cities

and citizens in the construction of society, Federico Mayor Zaraaoza, former director general of UNESCO and president of the Culture of Peace Foundation, delivered the conference "City and Education" and defended the role of cities in the construction of the world and highlighted the empowerment of women who, according to him, advance the dialogue to resolve conflicts. The last dialogue that could be followed was between the mayor of Badalona, Dolors Sabater, and the mayor of Granollers, Josep Mayoral, who agreed on the need to involve citizens in local government.

THEME OF THE CONGRESS

One theme, three axes




To prepare the proposal on the theme of the 18th Congress, which we are now presenting to you, we must first explain the steps followed.



The first step was to form a consultative group of technicians from various services in our organisation.



We asked this group to draw up a list of challenges they believe cities face now and in the near future. Naturally, each challenge had to be justified by objective data.



Once we had this list, we invited other people from the municipal organisation and civil society to prioritize and define what they considered to be the three most relevant CHALLENGES.

Reflection

The design of new strategies

An analysis of the methodologies of the models used

The socialization of experiences

As you know, each Congress deals with an issue, a topic that promotes: These were the three challenges agreed upon:




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First challenge

The complexity of cities

Cities are increasingly diverse and pluralistic. They contain more communities within them and need inclusion policies so no one is left out and everyone can continue to build a community that includes everybody, the city itself.





Polarised societies

They lack the critical capacity to face excessive and contradictory information and a flood of messages that move through networks, aiming to create Manichaean scenarios: good vs evil, my people vs the others. **More than ever, it is necessary to promote new scenarios and above, all new actions that encourage training to develop critical thinking capable of making us truly free.**



Citizens, on the whole, lack awareness of their cultural needs and, above all, of their creative abilities. Many understand creativity as something alien, which has nothing to do with them. Creativity is absolutely necessary to generate social, personal and collective talent. We need creative citizenship that generates more resources and strategies, which will allow us to be better positioned to face the challenges of the future. We submitted this first document to the Scientific Committee. We held several meetings with each of its members, adding their suggestions and contributions, and finally prepared the proposal with them, which we present to you with the title:


"EDUCATION and CULTURE: strategies for constructing the CITY / COMMUNITY and developing a CRITICAL and CREATIVE CITIZENSHIP"

The three axes that we will follow are:



Construction of the city/community in increasingly complex cities.

The construction of "US", which defines the feeling of freely belonging to "our" city, everyone's city.



The development of a critical and free citizenship that will participate in the construction of the future of cities. Training and promotion of CRITICAL THINKING to acquire tools against sectarianism, populist discourses, and manipulation of information.



The development of creative citizenship with strategies and tools to face the challenges of society.

Articulated

Lectures and dialogues to encourage reflection and thought. A sample of experiences to learn about the projects presented by the cities. The methodologies used in these, in terms of strategy construction and design. Study visits to learn about the experiences being developed on the subject in the territory, and its protagonists.



City/ Community

Our cities are now more diverse than twenty years ago. In the last two decades, this has been one of the most relevant elements in the transformation that has occurred in urban areas. More diverse and pluralistic cities that contain many communities: cultural, religious, linguistic, etc. This diversity opens the door to great opportunities, and it is a generator of great wealth, but at the same time, it is also a generator of great complexity, as well as possibly being a generator of exclusion processes. One of the challenges cities have to face is how, while respecting each constituent community, we can build the "COMMON US", which makes us feel that we are part of a community that includes everyone - the city. A community of which we are part through bonds that we build from freedom, where the presence and essence of the individual are compatible with the strength of the community dimension. The word "ubuntu" comes to mind here, a small word that sums up a great African idea. Mungi Gnomane expresses its meaning in the following way: There is "ubuntu"



when people unite for a common good, "ubuntu" reminds us that if we unite, we can overcome the problems and differences that separate us. It's very simple: I am because you are.

We need to know and acknowledge others. To contact and establish links with those who are not like us, with those who think or believe differently. This is why spaces for dialogue and conversation should be promoted, allowing us to understand all the worlds that coexist in the same city.

In a world that is highly interconnected by technology, we can observe that more than ever, there is a lack of personal contact with "physical" people - presence.

Inequalities that generate exclusion and call for policies that acknowledge this and, above all, act to reduce it.

Identity conflicts are present in these cities -our- cities. And against those who speak about multiple identities and their virtues, some covet identity essentialism. Some defend mixing, fusion and "contamination", while others move in the opposite direction: defending the "purity of the original essence". • • • • • • • •

Cities are becoming more diverse and plural. They contain more communities within them. They need policies of inclusion so that no one is left out and everyone can continue to build the community that includes us all, the city itself.


Everything we have mentioned so far converges in any person and group's "right to the city". A right that David Harvey considers to be not simply the right to access what already exists but the right to change it out of our deepest longings.

And in these "new" cities, we must preserve the old traditions and myths, but perhaps it is time to, together, think that we should also build new ones that represent us all. Myths that allow us to weave the community fabric.

Critical citizenship



We observe a surprising growth of movements that question what for some time now has been scientific and proven. The strength of beliefs seems to outweigh scientific evidence, and we have more and more followers of outlandish theories, even dangerous attitudes, such as the anti-vaccine movement, or "surprising and naive" beliefs, such as the flat-earthers, for example. At times, it seems that the Enlightenment did not exist and the days of obscurantism are returning.

In a recent article, Judit Carreras, the director of the Centre for Contemporary Culture in Barcelona, quoted Kant, the father of the Enlightenment, and recalled the three questions: What can I know? What do I do? What can I expect? And three hundred years later, knowledge, action, and hope are the illustrated legacy on which to think critically about the present, learn from the wounds of the past and reinvent a world that has stopped believing in the future. He went on to state that the foundations of this future must be creativity, imagination, reinforcing political and affective solidarity and critical thinking.

And we need to do this because we are at a time of extreme ideological polarization in our societies. Uncritical convictions, attitudes that make many people identify absolutely with a particular group and not question any of the group's decisions or actions. Groups that are increasingly important in our societies and that act in an ever more sectarian manner.

It is more necessary than ever to promote new scenarios and above all new actions that promote training to develop critical thinking, capable of making us authentically free.

Another issue that is not minor and which supports this new reality is the information published and disseminated through social media. Information that overwhelms us, that we are unable to process, and that is addressed to us and loaded with manipulation and falsehood. With media that is increasingly less free and acts more like a tool at the service of economic interests and presents dangerous biases, such as the invisibility of certain groups and the omnipresence of others.

This is the reason for, and it is no coincidence. a model of entertainment based on so-called "reality" programs that always generate models acting clearly with a "nocebo" effect, generating

values that cannot be described as civic and building democratic and supportive citizenship, rather the contrary. These television and cable network programs present models based mainly on the idea of "Me first". And it does not matter "how" one obtains benefit.

Moreover, we cannot ignore the emergence of Artificial Intelligence with all its advantages and new opportunities but also the dangers it poses if there is no clear regulatory framework to control it.

Apparently, everything on the internet is free; We browse at no cost. But in the end, one pays the price for the algorithms that customise the commercial (and not just commercial) messages we receive.

Creative citizenship



Education for creativity has always been strongly undervalued by education systems and society in general. There has been a misunderstood utilitarian idea of education and a conceptual confusion regarding the terms innovation and creativity.

This has been simplified in the notion that creativity is "what artists do", as if this ability were not common to all humans. Education is precisely about generating skills, one of which is creativity.

Angélica Sátiro, a pedagogue and specialist in creative citizenship, believes that creating means generating new, more and better ideas. Ideas that can be applied in different fields through different languages. And these new ideas with value are the ones that transform and promote change, not just making use of the ones we already have.

The ability to create and innovate is necessary to face the future challenges of our cities.

We understand that to generate social capital, it is essential to develop the creative capacity of its citizens. That is why it is absolutely essential for us to meet our citizens' cultural and educational needs and promote programs to develop their creative abilities.

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More than ever, it is necessary to promote new scenarios and above, all new actions that encourage training to develop critical thinking capable of making us truly free.

In short, the proposed topic that we are presenting for the 18th Congress has the following title:

"EDUCATION and CULTURE,

strategies for constructing the CITY / COMMUNITY and developing a CRITICAL and CREATIVE CITIZENSHIP" We need to know and recognise others. We need to have contact and establish links with those who are not like us, with those who think or believe differently from us.

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It is divided into three axes:

- **1** Construction of the city /community in increasingly complex cities.
- 2 The development of a critical and free citizenship that will participate in the construction of the future of cities.
- **3** The development of creative citizenship with strategies and tools to face the challenges of society.

You can see that the process we have followed to reach this final formulation allows us to affirm that it is not a proposal arising from an intuition, a sudden inspiration. On the contrary, it is a mature approach, worked on rigorously, that we think connects perfectly with the significant challenges that our cities face in the present and future.

And we see the Congress as a great working tool, an opportunity to find answers and proposals that may be useful to us. And also, of course, find even more questions. • • • • • • • •

Identity conflicts are present in these cities. Contrary to those who proclaim multiple identities and their virtues, there are those who proclaim identity essentialisms.

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Likewise, and as we have already pointed out in Chapter 1, we are working with 32 cities in a thematic network of the Spanish Network. This is a network that we coordinate from Granollers with the support of several Catalan universities and members of the Scientific Committee.

The work has currently been initiated and will end in October 2025 and will possibly be extended until 2027. This means in practice that the contents of the topic we propose for the Congress are already being worked on, we are already analysing them, and research is being carried out.

This is no coincidence, far from it, this is how we designed it when we decided that our city wished to present this candidacy. We are convinced that this network will become an essential knowledge tool at the service of the 18th Congress.

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On the other hand, we find ourselves at a time of extreme ideological polarisation in our societies. We are always aiming at manichean positions: "my people, the good ones" and "the bad ones, the others".

Design the axes that we consider to be the backbone of the field of reflection and the experiences to be presented.


Share and agree on the format model for presentations, dialogues, reports and publications.

Yayo has intervened in drafting the latest version of the Charter in which the ecofeminist perspective has been significantly incorporated. Her intellectual and activist career and experience will provide us with ideas and proposals for the future, which the Congress must incorporate. Especially when addressing issues of "community building" with the rights and duties that arise naturally when working in the field of "critical thinking".

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Nicolàs Barbieri

- Professor at the Open University of Catalonia.
- PhD in Political Science from the Autonomous University of Barcelona.
- His research focuses on the analysis and evaluation of cultural policies, especially in the field of cultural rights and social inequalities.
- He has carried out various advisory and training tasks for public and private institutions and has helped to promote and evaluate educational cultural programs.
- He co-coordinated the first Participation and Cultural Needs Survey in Barcelona and has participated developing public policy: "Culture and Education in Barcelona".

His work and publications are highly oriented towards cultural rights and access to and participation in culture. His research has basically focused on the city of Barcelona and some cities in its metropolitan area. The results of this research can be very useful in developing the strategies we can devise, from culture, for the construction of communities, and to have culture as a vector of change and transformation.

Professor Nicolás Barbieri also assumes a significant part of the responsibility in the coordination of the Thematic Network that we are working with 32 cities of the State, and that has the same theme as we propose for the Congress: *"Education and Culture strategies for the construction of city/community and the development of critical and creative thinking"*.

- From 2001 to 2008, she was head of studies at the Municipal School of Music of Can Ponsic (Barcelona), managed by the ARC Música Foundation.



It will also pay special attention to the methodologies of participation that may occur both in the face-to-face Congress and in the virtual Congress.

The Committee will also accompany the participation tables we are building with citizens. It will have the function of advising and supervising everything related to the content proposals and study visits.

It will also sometimes participate in the municipal political and technical coordination tables.

We require, as you can see, many things from the Committee, but especially that in May 2026 in Granollers, we can meet and listen to scientists, researchers, writers, etc. the most relevant people in the world to address the theme of the Congress and the challenges that arise.

And also, of course, that they rigorously select the best experiences, observe the common aspects to be able to generate models and their methodologies.

Naturally, they will be responsible for drafting the proposed Declaration and the conclusions of the Congress and some of its members will also actively participate in moderating dialogues and conferences.


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A Scientific Committee for a Congress and three Forums.

The Scientific Committee is also responsible for coordinating other Committees. Specifically, the Scientific Committees of the Youth Forum, the Adolescent Forum and the Children's Forum.

These three Forums will be held in parallel but will interact with the Congress at some point. Each Forum will have its own part of the programme with specific work and methodologies. And it will also have a part that it will share with the Congress program.

04 CITY PROJECTS

City/Community



A "conversation preservation" project aiming is to preserve the migratory story of many people in the city. We want to know where they came from, their motivations and how they got to Granollers, their city.

We wish to get to know them through their words, and preserve those words. It is a space for citizens' memory, where every citizen, every person, is important. The stories are relevant for each family and the entire city. All the pots are the same size. Only the colours change, showing their diversity and building, at the same time, a beautiful colourful mosaic on the shelves. The conversations have a person who listens and, if necessary, asks questions and the testimony that explains their journey. Many of those made so far have been created by students in 4th year of the ESO from all the schools in the city.

In each pot, there is a QR to listen to the audio, a written transcription, photographs and an object linked to the story that the witness wanted to deposit inside. We currently have over 600.

Granollers can present a varied collection of projects being executed and related to the theme and the axes we propose for the 18th Congress.

City/Community



Només d'Anada (One-way only)

This is a program of six sessions with six guests who have had a migratory experience and have generated thought and reflection about it in a book, a film, etc.

The program sessions were held at Roca Umbert, Fàbrica de les Arts. Each guest had twenty minutes to explain their experience. In the room, we find one hundred and sixty 4th year ESO students from several city High Schools. Next, we move on to another building with twenty-five round tables. Each student is assigned a table they will share with students from other schools. At each table there is also an enabler or facilitator, in this case, a student from a higher year, who will table issues related to everything the guest explained to them a few minutes ago.

And the conversation will begin. The guest visits all the tables. Getting asked questions, answering and listening to the conversations.

Initially, each table asks the guest questions, and each student expresses, using cards, the feelings, thoughts and ideas that come to their heads during the session they have experienced. They can also do this by drawing. These two activities are focused on the idea of "WE" and not on the concept of emigrants, newcomers, residents, ...

And we do it because this word, this US, includes all of us since we are all children, grandchildren or great-grandchildren of migrants.

There are no cities without migrants and migration is a fact of the human condition. Humans have always moved, today is no different.

Sentimental chronicle of the SOTA EL CAMÍ RAL neighbourhood

This proposal was born to disseminate a chronicle of the Sota el Camí Ral neighbourhood, comprising twenty-five stories appreciated and loved by its inhabitants. These stories were collected through a participatory process with members of the Neighbourhood Association, the Merchants Association, the Families Association and the local School's teaching staff.

First, we decided which stories could constitute an itinerary and were sufficiently representative of the life of the neighbourhood in the 1960s and 70s. We also decided which people would explain them and where. It is, therefore, a tour of different corners of the neighbourhood where the neighbours themselves tell these stories of humble and simple people, full of gestures of humanity and solidarity, of civic and political commitment and entrepreneurship.

Each group of visitors is accompanied by a guide who takes them to all the designated places. At the end of the visit, each participant is presented with an illustrated plan and ten postcards with old photographs of the neighbourhood corresponding to some of the stories that were told.

We are currently working on the second phase; the second itinerary. In this itinerary, the neighbourhood residents will determine the stories of the present and what they want to highlight about their neighbourhood today and now, and we will generate a new itinerary, a new map and new postcards.

In the third phase, we will make an itinerary created by boys and girls and looking to the future. Once the project is completed, we will have three itineraries:

The Children's Neighbourhood

The frog song from a pond in "Sota el camí Ral"

This project is being promoted by a Neighbourhood Association, an Association of Merchants, a School, a High School, a Music School, the Municipal Conservatory, and the Natural Science Museum. Other participants are a children's literature writer, an illustrator and a composer.

Together, we have built a story that aims to create a new myth, a new story that can be used to explain ourselves. A tale to affirm who we are and what we are like. That talks about "us." All the inhabitants of Granollers in 2024. From everyone, about everyone. The story has to do with our place name: Granollers. The name Granollers comes from "granoller", which in ancient Catalan meant "place where there are frogs". "Granolla" is the word that in ancient Catalan meant frog -"granota" in modern Catalan. This means that Granollers literally means a place with many frogs.

Asking our scientists, they tell us that indeed this valley where our city was built has always been favourable for frogs. In fact, before Homo Sapiens Sapiens, they and other amphibians inhabited this area. Right in the most vulnerable neighbourhood of the city, there is a pond. A pond that, if correctly naturalised, could be a good place for a colony of frogs to live.

The story we have created tells us that there have always been very special frogs in these ponds, frogs that croak with unusual frequency. A frequency that can only be perceived by children. It is also said that their croaking sounds like a song when the days approach the solstice (winter and summer). Specialists from the Natural Science Museum have recorded them. And these sounds have been passed on to the musicians at the Conservatory. The composer Paula Grandes adapted the sounds and wrote the lyrics.

The result is a beautiful song that is very similar to Paul McCartney's: "We All Stand Together" Right now, this song is being rehearsed by the children of the Petits Cantors choir in the *Amics de la Unió* School of Music and the Ferrer i Guàrdia School with their families, a choir formed by children and their parents.

City/Community

We are currently working on organising a special party, which we would like to become a tradition for next summer's solstice. At this party, the song will be sung by all the choirs, and stories will be told.

One of them will be very special: the tale of *The Frogs in the Pond*. These tales of pond frogs always make us look at ourselves in a mirror. This frogs' pond is a small frogs' town where everything is possible, and things are done that are not done in the city.

The frogs in the pond are as diverse as the citizens of Granollers. Everyone can identify with them.

The legend story also says that if, during these winter and summer solstice nights, you approach the pond and sing the frog's song, you get what you ask: to pass an exam, receive the "yes" of a loved one, overcome a challenge...

It always works; you just have to be there and sing.



Arbres que ens il·luminen (Trees that enlighten us)

This is a project by an Association of Merchants to beautify and illuminate the streets for Christmas. The proposal is to give meaning and light to each tree.

We believe that Christmas is a good time of the year to highlight stories that show attitudes of achievement, struggle for human rights, and solidarity. Stories that tell us about the dignity of human beings. That is why the project consists of twenty stories, each placed in a light fixture under a tree. A tree that illuminates a story that looks like a Christmas story. But it's not; it's very real.



This is a school handball tournament that invites all children from all schools in the city to practice this sport during the month of May. This means that all schools have their own teams and families accompanying them. It is an excellent opportunity to clearly see our city's magnificent human diversity. A diversity that we can observe on the field and in the stands. Handball becomes an element of shared identity.

Everyone's a winner.

This is a magnificent tool for actively participating in the life of the city and feeling part of it.

The festivity is based on a game where two groups, two gangs, the Whites and the Blues, are challenged to see who is able to generate more noise and also win more competitions. For a week, a (secret) jury will validate the creative and fun proposals generated by the groups in each gang. A significant number of very diverse competitions are held.



Just wrap a white or blue scarf around your neck and participate in any of these competitions. And if you want, you can also join a group in these gangs and participate creating the proposals. Or even create a new group. The festivity is an excellent place to make social cement, using Erik Klinenberg's terminology. To generate processes of inclusion, a feeling of belonging, and to build creative citizenship.





Popular Universityt

The Universitat Popular or Popular University of Granollers (UPG) was founded in 2014 and is the consequence of the success of philosophical gatherings held in the city's libraries since 2007. The organisers of these talks saw an increase in the number of attendees, students eager for knowledge and eager to participate, and at the same time, an increase in the number of teachers of other subjects who wanted to generate similar spaces.

The Popular University (UPG) is a non-profit cultural entity managed by AIEP (Popular Education Promotion Association). It incorporates a wide range of training in various branches of knowledge, with academic and scientific rigour. Rooted in the capital of Vallès Oriental and with a firm vocation to openness to all, the UPG's educational proposal is primarily aimed at all those seeking an overall vision and an integrated knowledge perspective, regardless of their current academic level.

The UPG aims to promote education based on dialogue, encouraging shared reflection and critical analysis as a driving force for social transformation. Faced with a certain massification of the cultural offer, its promoters think it is convenient to decouple learning from the economy and material benefit, facilitating access to education for people of any socioeconomic status and at any level of training. Therefore, the recipients of the courses are all those with cultural and formative concerns who consider learning a necessary process that continues throughout life.

It is undoubtedly a great project to promote a critical spirit.



En-raonar

In 2017, when events occurred in Catalonia that generated great political and social tension, a group emerged called EN-RAONAR.

This group is united by the idea that we must use critical thinking more than we do, find new ideas and projects to revitalise democracy and continue to learn ways for different people to live together. Steps must be taken in the direction of equity and social justice, and we must work for the common good. With a clear objective of creating meeting and conversation spaces with those who usually do not meet and do not think alike. The strength of the proposal lies in the need to think, reflect, speak and, above all, to listen to others. The En-raonar group has since developed several activities. The most successful is holding talks and dialogues with relevant people who provide different perspectives on a given current conflict. The speakers' proposals are always plural and diverse, like the audience.



It was born from the Cine Club of the Cultural Association, an association that turned seventyfive this year. Cinema Edison focuses mainly, apart from film and documentary screening programs, on particular projects and programs such as:

The Book and Film Club / Conversations with filmmakers / Presentation of premieres / The Fantàstik Festival / La Peixera, a space for creating short films collectively created by young people aged 16-26. / The Cine Club Jove / Cine Forum Sessions

All these activities encourage a free and critical attitude and are an excellent place to enjoy cinema in all its dimensions.



Ópera Aperta (Open Opera); the art and word festival of Granollers

It is a festival of thought that was born after the global 2020 pandemic. Promoted and produced by the Museum of Granollers, it arose to cover the need to generate spaces for joint reflection around issues that involve us personally and collectively. With the challenge of resignifying life and the place of humans in the world. New times, new challenges to reflect on and new questions.

Each year, the Festival selects a piece from the museum's collection around which the proposed theme, the object of debate and the reflection revolve.

2020:

In its first edition, Opera Aperta used a **head of Bacchus**, a second-century Roman sculpture found in excavations in the city, to invite us to talk and reflect on life and its possible meanings.

In ancient Rome, Bacchus was the god of vines and ecstasy, tragedy and dance, creativity and everything that escapes reason and constitutes the vital impulse or passion for life. And they asked, among others, the following questions:

Who does the management of life depend on? Where does our incorruptible commitment to life come from? How can we understand this desire to endure, which we call life? What do philosophy, science and art say about it?

2021:

Retrat de la senyoreta Dulce (Portrait of Miss

Dulce). Antoni Caba (1838–1907), The presence and persistent gaze of the "young lady" invited us to investigate where the notion of person begins and ends. And some of the issues that were raised: What makes us people? What makes us different from each other? What version of ourselves do we have, and does it match what others have of us? What is the boundary between the person and the character?

2022:

An installation by Francesc Abad called "*Spuren o Rastres*" is the work that invited us to discuss the notion of travel. The different meanings of travel were discussed In this edition.

2023:


A work by Jordi Benito was used: "*Voici dans l 'eau ma chair de lune et de rosée*" from 2005. A work inspired by Paul Valéry's poem "*Narcisse parle*", from the book *Album de vers anciens* (1920).

« "The music of numbers enamours me, like art, like poetry," Benito explained. Poetry and mathematics are two approaches to understand the irreducible mystery of reality.

Benito's work is an installation of light, a blue neon that creates a game of aquatic reflections and invites debate on notions such as image, reflection and reality. A conceptual line that refers to one of the great themes of thought: the question of reality.

What can we consider real? How should we move today in a world of replicated realities? How can we distinguish what is real from what is pure imposture?

With these questions as a guide, the fourth edition was presented. At the moment the program is ending the fifth edition of a festival that has already been consolidated in the cultural program of our city's spring.





Panoràmic is a festival that explores the relationship between cinema, photography and new forms of images and promotes and encourages the search for new languages and audio-visual narratives. Born in 2017 with a vocation to of critical pedagogy of the image aimed at audiences increasingly immersed in visual environments, and therefore aiming to be helpful.

Panoramic proposes a space of knowledge and reflection between still and moving images. And it does so by encompassing all the areas where the image is present, i.e., through projections of feature films and short films, video, video installations, video games, mappings, exhibitions, workshops, conferences, workshops, TV, installations, archives, bibliography, photobooks or interactive projects, among others.

Since the first edition, ideas and concepts have been developed, such as "photo-fixed" with *Film Still* (2017), the revolt with 68 *The Whole World is Watching* (2018), the space with the Ultima Thule, the conquest of space (2019), the transitions of intimacy with *Extimacy. Public* – *Privat* – *Secret* (2020) and *Incertesa-Atzar-Predicció* (2021)

Panoràmic is consolidated as a reference festival for culture, exhibiting visual arts in multiple forms and creative processes. Thus, from education and

training, reflection and dialogue, transversality and hybridisation, creativity and learning and the commitment to contemporary and plural culture, Panoramic aims to become a benchmark in cities and the whole country.

The Panoràmic festival is directed by Joan Fontcuberta, Laia Casanova and Albert Gusi and has an advisory team comprising Andrés Hispano, Mercè Alsina and Fèlix Pérez-Hita. Throughout the five editions the work of artists such as Erwin Wurm. Weronika Gesicka. Israel Ariño, Clara Gassull, Julie Freeman, María Cañas, Carles Barba, Joachim Smichd, John Akomfrah, Dina Kelberman, Jonathan Brown, Albert Serra, Roberto Huarcaya, Clement Cheroux, Antoine d 'Agata, Itziar Okariz, Isaki Lacuesta, Pere Portabella, José Luís Guerin, William Klein, Sophie Calle, Laia Abril, Martin Arnold, Jorge Furtado, Harun Farocki, David Lynch, Sylvie Bussieres, Eugenia Balcells, Chris Marker, Pilar Rosado, Marcelo Brodsky, Simon Menner, Mireia Sallarès. Kurt Caviezel. Veronica Fieiras. Cabosanroque, Jordi Borràs, Ventura Pons, Cristina Núñez, Lurdes Basolí, Daniel G. Andujar, Manel Armengol, Alicia Kopf, Silvia Isach and Roger Subirana, Marcel · lí Antúnez, Frederic Amat, Cristina De Middel and Martin Parr, have participated in the Festival, to name a just a few.





Day of Arts, Education, Thought and Culture

This day brings together technicians and those responsible for the educational projects of Cultural Centres in Catalonia and the rest of Spain. These days are always focused on collective work, part of which is prior and done by each person from their city. The other part takes place during the day, collectively in a warehouse in Roca Umbert, a factory of the arts, in Granollers.

Ideas and strategies are constantly being sought so that cultural proposals reach more audiences, and they are more involved. And they naturally promote critical thinking and stimulate the creative capacity of audiences. The days always contain an element of reflection, another of conversation and a part of creativity.

From a textile factory to an art factory

The Roca Umbert factory began to be built in 1904. In 1936, workers requisitioned the company, and it was named *Espartacus*. In January 1939, it suffered severe destruction due to arson, but slowly recovered and in the 1950s, a power plant was built to give the factory a reliable electricity supply since constant electrical restrictions often forced production to stop. Then, modernisation of the industry began, and a large number of fabrics were manufactured, highlighting cotton garments. Dressing gowns, towel sets, tablecloths, military clothes, denim garments ... The factory closed in 1991.

The transformation process

One-third of the area of the former Roca Umbert textile factory belongs to the municipality. In January 2003, the Plenary Session of the City Council of Granollers approved the Use Plan of the Roca Umbert project as a factory for the arts, and in November 2004, the Architectural Master Plan was approved. Both documents have been the roadmap that has guided the rehabilitation of the 21,000 m² that Roca Umbert currently has, to become a new centre for contemporary creation.

Since the opening of the Technological and University Centre (2003), Roca Umbert has been a project in continuous evolution: in 2005, the library was inaugurated; in 2006, La Troca Centre for Popular and Traditional Culture, the bar, the musical rehearsal space and the offices; in 2008, the Arts Space; in 2009, the Audio-visual Centre; in 2010, the NauB1 Musical Creation and Dissemination Centre and the multipurpose *Dents de Serra* building, and in 2011 the production workshops of the main festival and the Thermal Workshop were rehabilitated in a first phase of the works, as a centre for interpreting the industrial past. At the same time, private companies have been established in Roca Umbert: *Taller Sarandaca* (2005), *Arsènic, Espai de Creació* (2011) and the workshop of visual artist Joan Fontcuberta **(2013)**.

Roca Umbert is a cultural space in constant transformation, at the service of creative processes, artistic training and dialogue between the arts, which advances by cooperating with the emerging economic fabric, especially with the audio-visual industry.

Its multidisciplinary nature and comprehensive approach to creation, which includes research, creation, training, production and dissemination, are the axes of action of the areas that comprise Roca Umbert, and its activity is intensified as the rehabilitation of the buildings progresses.

A unique setting where literature, music, popular culture, visual arts, audio-visuals, thought, heritage can be combined and intertwined to experiment in all fields of contemporary creation and where they can be shared between creators and citizens.

Open and collaborative innovation that makes Roca Umbert a laboratory rather than a container, cooperating with the economic and social fabric of the city of Granollers.

Creative citizenship



Laboratori de lletres i imatges (Words and images laboratory)

The *laboratori de lletres i imatges* is a space for creation within the Roca Umbert Library that invites families to experiment with reading, understood in the broadest sense of the term: reading with all the senses, reading images and sounds, literary creation as a game, poetic imagination as an artistic form...

Decalogue of the laboratory characteristics:

1 . **Books are the source of inspiration**, the starting and arrival points. Without books, there is no laboratory.

2. The physical presence of books and their reunion with children and adults through a time of **shared reading** is essential.

3. The final facilitator or enabler may be external, but **the laboratory is born from an objective or need of the library**, and it is designed and executed together with the staff of the children's area.

4. Books are the engine of an experience that may or may not include a plastic workshop, but in no case is the product the objective. The process is what is important.

5. The search for beauty in the presentation, the care of the aesthetics of the space and the creation of rituals are crucial to achieving the surprise effect. The small details and objects add value to the experience, complete it and facilitate a particular disposition of spirit in the families.

6. The idea is to create unique, affective and experiential experiences around reading and books that endure in the children's memory.

7. The diversity of the library's collection is shown. Instead of classifying books, they are declassified, and new links are sought between them. 8. Families are not passive recipients but are asked to be very actively involved. The facilitator gives them all the prominence to become a guide or companion.

9. From books or stories, creativity is what allows us to reach new forms of literary, artistic, theatrical, musical games, etc., expression.

10. There is a will to comprehensively document its operation and disseminate the proposals on the network so that they can be shared, evaluated, improved and adapted, following the current commitment to 2.0 and the collective construction of new realities.

Education sectoral committee: composed of representatives of the Municipal School Council.



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The transverse nature of the work with technicians from various areas has been operative from the very first minute, specifically in the way we have worked on this dossier that you have in your hands.








06 INVOLVEMENT OF CIVIL SOCIETY

We will also be overseeing the constitution of other commissions and working groups, if applicable, linked to the holding of supplementary activities at the Conference.



Granollers is the hub city around which a conurbation composed of three other municipalities has expanded, namely, Canovelles, Les Franqueses and Roca del Vallès. These three municipalities form an urban continuum and share a range of services.

Granollers is also the capital of Vallès Oriental which is composed of 39 municipalities including Mollet del Vallès, Sant Celoni, Caldes de Montbui, Montmeló and La Garriga. It occupies an area of 735 km2 and has a population of 422,777 inhabitants.

It is an urban area that represents the second urban ring in Barcelona.





Granollers presents its candidacy backed by the mayors composing the conurbation and the support of the region of Vallès Oriental through the president of its Council, Mr. Emili Cordero. We will be collaborating with all the towns and cities of the region to prepare, organise and hold the Conference. We will establish work and coordination spaces alongside them to establish the appropriate participation channels.

08 THE YOUTH FORUM

This has been a relevant topic around the AICE Executive Committee table.

It would seem counterintuitive to develop the design and proposals for the future of our cities without taking into account the generation of young people. They are the very people who will be most affected. This is behind our concern with creating spaces and time to allow young people to reflect, debate, and create proposals from their point of view and that could also be added to and be presented in the conclusions of the latest conferences.

Young people's view of reality from their own perspective is obviously differently. It is a view that we cannot fail to include and be very mindful of.

We believe that this is something we must do from the very start to get it right. This is why we are currently organising meetings with various groups of young people in the city. We want to formalise these meetings with the preparation of a "Youth Forum" conceived and designed by young people.

This Youth Forum will have its own work spaces, specifically in ROCA UMBERT, Arts factory. This former textile factory is now a centre for the creation, production and dissemination of cultural activities. Their warehouses will host part of the specific programme. The other part of the programme is what will be shared in the plenary sessions with the rest of the delegates. Roca Umbert is just 400m from Palau de Congressos, barely 4 minutes by foot. This Youth Round Table will not only offer opinions and generate proposals about the Youth Forum but will also about the Conference in general.

We obviously cannot provide any more details about the work and methodologies due to being something we are just beginning to work on, as already explained above.

What we have determined is that 100 young people from the city/county will be participating. We will aim to have 50 boys and 50 girls studying or working in the following fields: Education, Culture, Humanities, Social Sciences, Arts, Urban Spaces, Architecture, Social Work.

We will also draft a proposal that can reach all the young people in the city and collaborate with those who have left the education system, for example, and promote their participation through channels that we still have to define.

One of the issues we face when it comes to getting the city's young people to participate in our Conferences are the administrative difficulties in granting grants, scholarships, etc. We cannot yet offer an easy and plausible proposal for travel at this time. However, in terms of accommodation, we do. Any young people from Granollers and the Vallès Oriental region who wish to participate in the Forum will have to commit to hosting another young person from another city anywhere in the world. In exchange, the young people from Granollers who do this will also be hosted by the people they offer accommodation to. So it's about what we all understand as exchange. • • • • • • • •

All young people, including those coming from other cities, must be training, work or be studying in the areas we have mentioned above.

The other essential requirement for everyone is to master the English language due to being the language used at the Youth Forum.

We are therefore working on the proposal to organise a "Youth Forum" involving 200 young people, 100 from Granollers and its region and 100 from the rest of the world's cities.

This Youth Forum will also have a significant space for COLLABORATIVE CREATIVITY processes in its programme across various areas, particularly in the social and artistic areas.

There will also be dedicated mingling spaces, and others that will form part of the set of activities of the General Conference (visits, meals, etc.)



Other fora

We also wish to take the opportunity to organise a shared reflection with teenagers and children from the whole region.

This of course involves planning a Youth Forum and a Children's Forum as we already mentioned in chapter 3.

Actually, practically every city and town in the region has its own Council for Children and Adolescents, involving their contributions to the Conference jointly and following suitable dynamics and methodologies from their viewpoint. Both will have a Scientific Committee responsible for the work and they will be supported by technical staff for all the tasks and activities taking place.

These fora will take place at the Museum of Natural Sciences.

All conclusions will be submitted to the Conference's Scientific Committee to be included in the final document.

Both children and teenagers will also participate in several plenary sessions of the Conference.

Young people obviously look at reality in a different way. It is a



SPACES AND FACILITIES

The Conference will be held in Granollers. We want the city to welcome, experience and feel it intensely. The city will be hosting guests from all over the world. And we will be preparing, adapting and adorning it to make everyone feel welcome.

We want "the city" to be centre stage. So much so that we are thinking of holding a "special" plenary session at Plaça de la Porxada, the hub of the city.

The whole city will be ready to host all the planned activities.

Green spaces.

However, before determining the specific spaces where we will hold the Conference, we would like to share a background idea: We look on the city as a space. We also believe that the central

spaces that must host the Conference, especially the Sports Hall transformed into a Congress Hall, must contain the city.


In other words, we are working on a conceptual model based on the idea of creating a city within the Palau itself that will contain:

Mingling spaces.

Containing furniture that allows you to sit, chat, take a break, have fun.

Work space.

Personal and group work. And individual work spaces for the organisation of the conference.



We are particularly aware of the need for all work spaces to include:

 Proper acoustics. Necessary to be able to comfortably follow the discussions without any elements that could distort the attention they require.

Proper visibility. If the distance between the speakers and certain participants requires it, we will have large screens for everyone to have a good view of what is happening. Each room will also have stages that allow the speakers to be seen comfortably from any position.

Comfort. We will use comfortable seats that allow us to work and participate in the sessions with the necessary level of comfort.

Clear signage. That allows us to move around the Palace and other facilities

safely and quickly. This is why the signage and the information signs must be of the right size to be clearly visible. They must be clear and not cause any confusion.

Building a pleasant atmosphere.

Where participants feel they are somewhere that makes them feel good. Surrounded by plants, flowers and natural air fresheners.



Warm lighting. That creates a welcoming atmosphere. With lots of natural light when possible as well as indirect light.



Rest areas with suitable furniture for rest and discussion. With natural light.

Breakfast and lunch area. That allow ease and comfort of access. This means organising several service lines to prevent any congestion. The proposed menus must consider a wide range to meet the tastes of all conference participants. It must also be suitable for a wide variety of diets. The space must also be pleasant, bright and comfortable. The tables and chairs must auarantee comfort and include natural elements that generate a pleasant atmosphere.



Outdoor space. Terraces with deckchairs, umbrellas, awnings and trees to enjoy a quick rest and the May sunshine and shade. This must be a "special" mingling space. Somewhere that facilitates discussion and getting to know other participants.

The Conference Hub (Sports Centre)

This building has a useful surface area of 8.295 m2. Opened in 1991, it has hosted numerous sporting events, as well as many other activities such as concerts, fairs, children's parks, literary awards, mass gatherings of the country's choirs, political rallies, etc.

We have enough space to host the rooms that the congress requires. And we can also, if necessary, generate external spaces (marquees, ...) that converge directly into the central space of the

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Conference Centre.

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We think of the city as a space. And at the same time we think that the central spaces that have to host the congress have to contain elemnts of the city.







The first:

The face-to-face Conference

We suggest holding it in May 2026.

In a world where technology allows us to connect with other people from any corner of the world and in which we belong to networks of people with whom we have never met in real life. In this hyper-connected world we believe that: An organisation like ours needs, more than ever, for its members to be able to meet physically, in person, and on a regular basis. That they do so while minimising the ecological footprint, and therefore, that they travel with a conscience, knowing which is the best option. But we believe that nothing can replace the experience the same things, at the same time and with other people.

And we also value the impact these experiences have on these people when they return to their cities.

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We are clearly committed to this format and will perform all the promotional campaigns to generate the desire to be there and participate.

This format will include everything required by the bases.

The face-to-face Conference

The second:

The virtual (online)

Just like the conference we talked about already. All the live broadcasts of all the conference plenary sessions will be prepared. The design these streaming sessions is already underway, bearing in mind that Granollers has already held these types of meetings to mark the International Day of the Educating Cities in 2019 and 2023. On these two occasions we held dialogues with mayors from other cities around the world, with Ada Colau, mayor of Barcelona, Pablo Javkin, mayor of Rosario, Koldo Narbaiza, education councillor of Bilbao and the mayor of Granollers Josep Mayoral in 2019. The philosopher Daniel Innerarity, the urban planner Zaida Muixí, the rector from the National University of Rosario Franco Bartolacci, and the philosopher Eulàlia Bosch also took part in this meeting.

We held the second session in 2023, in this case involving Ana González, mayor of Gijón, Alejandra Gutíerrez, mayor of León (Mexico), Maria Silvia Bacila, councillor for education in Curitiba (Brazil) and Alba Barnusell, mayor of Granollers. Professor Tica Font from the Delàs Centre and José Moisés Herrera, director of crime prevention and social participation in León, Michele Bravos, journalist and executive director of the Aurora Institute in Curitiba and sociologist and professor at the University of Oviedo Hans Van den Broek also participated in this session.

The digital format will be available to anyone who cannot travel. These people will be able to follow the plenary sessions comfortably while also feeling part of the conference. We will set up participation channels with these participants to be able to gather both their questions as well as their contributions.



The third:

The Conference website

Is a first for us that will allow us to hold an Open Conference from 1 January to 31 December 2026 using the website.

The Conference website is the space containing relevant information about the contents of the conference, therefore allowing anyone to access areas of knowledge, such as bibliographic references, various documents, talks in audiovisual format, relevant experiences and a space for participation to leave their opinions, generate questions and promote creative and collaborative proposals. In this regard, we will have devices for the creative generation of materials that can be displayed and presented during the process. The website will also be a space open to suggestions of all kinds.

And one important new feature already mentioned in the previous chapters 3 and 8.

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The 200 young people working with us in the Youth Forum, 100 teenagers in the Adolescent Forum and 100 children in the Children's Forum.

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One conference and four forums.

Each forum will contribute its conclusions to the conference that will enhance the closing statement.

A CITY ADAPTED TO THE NEEDS OF CHILDREN IS BETTER FOR EVERYONE.

This sentence by Tonucci inspires the following headline:

A conference that listens to the voices of children is better for everyone

The Italian pedagogue Francesco Tonucci created his project in 1991: "The city of children". As you are well aware, this project grants a very important role to children and to their participation in civic life. Tonucci has always asked politicians to listen carefully and to pay attention to children, their youngest citizens. He believes that listening to them has an added symbolic value thanks to how it enriches democracy. A Conference is a space for dialogue, for words. And it is also a space where we project thoughts, ideas and strategies towards the future. It seems a paradox that those who will be most affected by what we are planning do not participate. And this is because they are precisely the people with "the longest future" ahead of them.

This need is something we have already contemplated in our proposal as you have already seen. We believe that their voices must be heard, and their views, opinions and proposals shared, something we will be doing this with at least a hundred boys and girls from Granollers and the region.

This part of the Conference will be just as relevant as any other part. We will work together, using different methodologies as would be expected, related to the same challenges and the same issues as the rest of the conference.

And it goes without saying that we will be inviting Francesco Tonucci, an old friend from our city. We have no doubt that he will be happy.





CONGRESS SUSTAINABILITY MODEL

The creation of a sustainable event requires the design, organisation and implementation of actions that minimise negative social and economic environmental impacts and instead leave a positive legacy in its host community.

This involves the creation of a Sustainability Plan that contains the sustainability measures to be implemented at the event, those in charge of performing the action, the implementation deadlines and the follow-up indicator at a minimum.

We will therefore appoint someone to be in charge of coordinating the actions and monitoring the sustainability plan. Staff (organising team, suppliers and contractors, collaborators, etc.) will also be informed about the sustainability measures that are expected to be implemented at the event, and will be asked to be involved, highlighting the relevant role they can play to identify recommendations for improvement.

We will also inform attendees, organisation staff, supplier companies, etc. about the sustainability measures implemented and inform them about how they can contribute towards making the event more sustainable.

> MEASURES INCLUDED IN THE SUSTAINABILITY PLAN



Selecting the space and event location

The spaces we have selected to hold the Conference took these criteria into account as well as the details. The May weather in Granollers will rule out the need for any aircondition spaces. The average temperature during the second half of May is 21-23 degrees Celsius.





About mobility

- The Palau, ROCA UMBERT and the Museum of Natural Sciences are in very close proximity to each other and are very well connected by public transport (at just under 300 meters from urban and interurban bus stops and a train station that connects Granollers with Barcelona, Girona and France).
- Most of the accommodation in the city is located less than a 15-minute walk from the Conference venues.
- We will have spaces equipped for parking bicycles or other sustainable mobility equipment.



Energy efficiency. Commitment to renewable energy

We have:

- Spaces with adjustable natural light.
- Rooms with air conditioning systems separate to the rest of the building.
- Rooms sized for the expected audience, where the maximum capacity of the room is designed to host at least the expected capacity and to not exceed 15% of the maximum number of expected participants, or for the space to be modular.
- Low consumption and LED type lamps.
- Energy-efficient electronic and electrical equipment according to Energy Star, TCO or equivalent criteria; appliances, air conditioning systems and category A water heating devices.
- Independent lighting and air conditioning control systems for rooms or spaces.
- Charging points for electric vehicles (in the building itself or nearby).



- Renewable energy, in the case of the Palau that is produced on site.
- Staff in charge of the environmental management of the room who will be responsible for disconnecting the electrical devices, controlling the room's lighting and air conditioning. The air conditioning temperature ranges must be set to the time of year (maximum 21 °C in winter and minimum 26 °C in summer).



- We will have a selective collection system in place for the different fractions of waste generated to promote waste recovery guaranteeing the maximum possible recovery of collected materials.
- The premises will have selective collection containers for all waste generated (including the organic fraction) marked in a clear, instructional and visible manner identifying the type of waste they contain to allow attendees to separate their waste.
- We will ensure the proper ultimate management of all fractions of selectively collected waste.



We will have timed automatic shut-offs or with flow regulators, saving devices in toilets and urinals, etc.), while ensuring the proper management of waste water.



We also have the following in place:

- Resources to organise video conferences and for retransmitting presentations.
- We will have agreements in place with transport companies (e.g. taxi services) that provide the service with vehicles with an eco label or zero emissions according to the General Directorate of Traffic.
- We will request equipment that operates with rechargeable batteries for the simultaneous interpretation service. This same requirement will be extended to other services that require the use of equipment that operate with batteries.
- Decorative elements, such as the use of reusable elements will be requested (e.g. plant ornaments: live plants that can later be transplanted but no natural cut plants or flowers under any circumstances)





Location:

- Most of the planned accommodation is located less than 1 km from the Conference venue. We will promote commuting by foot, bicycle, etc.
- They are well connected by public transport, less than 20 minutes away from the location where the event takes place.
- The Conference organisation expects the transport of conference attendees from the hotels (round trip). We will include that fuels used must be efficient and with the smallest possible ecological footprint when hiring a bus fleet.



Design, assembly and disassembly of the installations

- We will prioritise the rental of materials. If materials cannot be rented, we will try to use reused or recycled materials, or wood that comes from sustainably managed forests (FSC or PEFC certificate).
- We will consider options that facilitate the subsequent reuse of materials, such as modular stands that are easy to assemble and disassemble, recyclable and foldable to minimise environmental effects and transport costs.
- We will opt for rental (reusable) carpets if they are required. If this is not possible, we will ensure that they can be used at other events through the agreement with associations, entities, etc.
- We will try to use environmentally friendly materials such as recycled and recyclable plastics, or cellulose or other biodegradable materials, without any adhesives.



Product range

- We will request for products served to be local in the contract with the supplier companies.
- Fresh and seasonal fruits and vegetables.
- Food and drinks from organic farming (juices, fruit, etc.).
- Organic and fair-trade coffee.
- Seed and stone fruit grown following integrated production criteria.
- Drinks must be supplied in jugs or glass bottles, preferably ones that can be returnable. Drinks must not be supplied in single-use containers.
- We will use reusable trays, plates, glasses and cutlery. If this is not possible, they must be made with compostable materials, which must be managed as an organic fraction.
- We will use reusable tablecloths and napkins. In the event that this is not possible, they must be made from 100% recycled paper.

- Products will not be served in individual portions, giving priority to bulk purchases (such as sugar, coffee, milk, oil, etc.).
- We will ask supplier companies in the contract to purchase products with reusable, compostable packaging or with a high percentage of recycled material.
- We will selectively collect different fractions of the waste generated (at least organic matter, cooking oil, paper and cardboard, packaging, glass and waste).
- The supplier companies must have clearly marked selective collection containers that identify the type of waste they contain.
- We will perform the ultimate management of the different fractions collected selectively, through the contracted public service.

Food waste

- We will adjust the amounts of food to the actual needs (according to the expected attendees according to registration).
- We will have a food donation programme for social organisations.
- A few days before the Conference, we will send attendees a reminder such as the one below:

"If you have registered and will not be able to attend the event, we would appreciate it if you let us know to allow us to adjust the catering and prevent any food waste."



Attention to diversity

• Establishment of agreements with associations, entities, etc. to facilitate the use of the materials at the end of the event.

Other aspects

- We will procure a range of healthy foods, avoiding excess animal protein, saturated fats and sugary and processed products.
- We will inform attendees about the sustainability features of the catering (e.g., identification of the source of local products, intended use of leftover food, etc.).
- We will identify any allergens of the products offered. In the event that this is not possible, it will be necessary to ensure that the staff has this information.

Passenger and goods transport involves energy consumption and emissions into the atmosphere. Good Practices in the different phases of the event must be considered to reduce the ensuing impacts, taking into account all possible agents involved such as attendees, contracting services, etc.

Measures to promote sustainable mobility

- We will provide information before and during the Conference on the sustainable means of transport available (public transport, on foot, bicycle, etc.) and on the electrical charging points at the venue of the event (availability and characteristics), if applicable.
- We will take the opportunity to publicise the sustainable means of transport available whenever we communicate and send the information about the place where the Conference will take place.

- We will ensure that travel (such as visits to facilities as part of the organisation of a conference) can take place in group or shared transport.
- We will schedule the events taking into account the availability of public transport and avoiding peak times to improve the comfort of attendees.
- We will offer incentives to encourage the use of public transport. ALL CONFERENCE ATTENDEES provided with their corresponding accreditation will be able to use it free of charge during the days of the Conference.
- We will inform participants about the benefits of using sustainable means of transport.
- We will indicate the location of public transport stops.



Contracting transport companies

We will request the following when hiring the corresponding services:

- For group transport to be sized to the needs of the service and for the maximum capacity of the vehicle (passenger seats) to not exceed 15% of the maximum number of expected passengers and for journeys to be planned so that the minimum possible number of journeys is made
- For the transport fleets to be low impact: vehicles with an eco label or zero emissions according to the General Directorate of Traffic

and preferably with the Environmental Quality Guarantee Badge. If this is not possible, vehicles will be required to be Euro VI.

- For the companies to have certifications that guarantee commitment to the environment (Environmental Quality Assurance Badge, EMAS, ISO 14001 or equivalent) and/or evidence of the organisation's commitment to sustainability.
- For their staff to be trained in efficient driving techniques.



Cleaning products

- We will use products that meet the requirements of some type I ecolabel (Nordic Swan, European Union Ecolabel or equivalent) (except cases justified by disinfection issues).
- We will prioritise the purchase of concentrated cleaning products and ensure the correct dosage.
- We will purchase products wholesale, preferably in returnable or easily recyclable containers.
- We will collect the waste generated at the facilities while ensuring the proper final management of the waste in accordance with the existing selective collection circuits.
- We will label and store product packaging correctly (product name, hazard pictograms, instructions for use, etc.).



Communication and promotional items

- We will have the safety data sheets for the products.
- We will train and inform staff with recommendations to ensure the proper dosage of products, the correct management of waste and the rational use of resources (water, electricity, etc.).
- We will have containment and collection protocols and materials to deal with accidental spills of products.

We will issue communications before, during and after. Saving resources and minimising the environmental impact of communication materials must be a basic and constant premise throughout all stages of the Conference.

Obsolescence, reuse and digitisation

- We will design the materials and texts avoiding identifying the year, day number, etc. with the aim of reusing these materials in subsequent events.
- We will reuse roll ups and other materials.
- We will evaluate the option of using digital identification and communications. In the event that this is not possible, a system will be established to reuse the accreditations.

Gifts and delivered items

Regarding promotional materials and giveaways:

• We will prioritise products with a low environmental impact, preferably manufactured by work placement companies, special work centres or social initiative cooperatives.

Working in a network has allowed us to meet other people and live in their cities "for a few days" and host them in ours.

Working as a network has allowed us to join forces, to add and sometimes, not infrequently, to multiply.

Granollers is a city that assumes the interdependence of our world and the need of cities to connect and participate in networks and spaces where we can give and receive in an active and committed manner.

Mayors for Peace

This organisation is composed of 8,349 cities from 166 countries around the world. Its work focuses on three objectives:

- 1. A world without nuclear weapons.
- 2. Achieving safer and more resilient cities.
- 3. Promoting a culture of peace in all places.

In 1983 the mayors of Hiroshima and Nagasaki promoted the programme to promote the solidarity of the cities towards the total abolition of nuclear weapons. In 1985, the First International Conference of Mayors for Peace was held. In 1986 the Conference became a permanent organisation. The city of Granollers is part of its Executive Committee and assumes one of its vice-presidencies. Last October, the mayoress of Granollers, Alba Barnusell, participated in the 3rd Forum of mayors and mayoresses of the United Nations held in Geneva representing Mayors for Peace.

Granollers expresses its commitment as a city that wishes to build a project for a culture of peace and historical memory. Granollers was bombed on 31 May 1938 and 25 January 1939 during the Spanish Civil War.

The Can Jonch Peace Culture Centre was created in 2008 with the aim of generating discourse and educational proposals for a culture of peace and cooperation and to promote historical memory.

The cities belonging to the Mayors for Peace will receive our special invitation to attend and participate at the 18th Congress of Educating Cities, considering that these cities can make relevant contributions in the areas of interest to us.

And all this not only for a matter of efficiency, but also, more importantly, as it needs to be part of the culture of the city council's organisation.

We should always ask ourselves which other cities do we work with? We in Granollers acquired this culture years ago and we are aware of the benefits it brings to the city.

13 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

The city of Granollers hosts several international events every year that form part of its traditional calendar of activities.

These are some of the most established ones that take place:



This was first held in 1998. This year it celebrates its 25th year. It is the most important international men's and women's handball championship in Southern Europe.

It takes place during the final week of June, with the participation of **more than six thousand athletes**. Teams from **47 nationalities from five continents** participated in the Granollers Cup.

The matches are played in 22 facilities. This is a very popular tournament in international handball.



The 37th edition will take place next February 2024. This is a prestigious race that internationally renowned athletes accompanied by popular athletes participate in every year. Some of these renowned athletes who have participated in the Granollers Half Marathon include: HAILE GEBRSELASSIE , STEFANO BALDINI, SAMUEL WANJIRU, STEOHEN KIPROTICH, MATTHEW KIPKOECH, ABRAHAM KIPTUM, HAGOS GEBREHIVET.

More than 12,000 athletes take part in the Granollers Half Marathon. Some of them come from other countries of the world who attend thanks to the prestige of the race and its organisation.



This is a festival of images that offers a range of exhibitions in various formats throughout the city. The works are by Spanish and international renowned artists. The 2024 version is now in its 8th year. This Festival has already consolidated itself on the Spanish arts scene and that has already generated links with other international festivals such as: Les Recontres d'Arles (France), one of the main photography festivals in Europe, as well as the Belgrade Photo Month, the one held in Quebec (Canada) and that of Manizales, Colombia.



JazzGranollers first took place in 1935 with the aim of promoting jazz and improvised music in Granollers and the region. The association organises an annual jazz cycle at the Casino and the Granollers Jazz Festival.

This festival has a long history. Celebrating 52 years this 2024. Its programme always features international artists.

Festival of International Choirs



This twice-yearly event is organised by the Friends of the Union Association, a meeting and shared work space for various children's and youth choirs from different countries around the world. Despite being recent, it has already choirs from Belgium, Italy, France, Germany, Portugal and Uganda. This congress was held from 6 to 9 December 2023, organised by the Spanish Society for the Conservation and Study of Mammals (SECEM), the Museum of Natural Sciences of Granollers and the Department of Climate Action, Food and Rural Agenda of the Generalitat [regional government] of Catalonia and taking place at the Teatre Auditori in Granollers. International Symposium on the Importance of Bats as Bioindicators



This Congress was held from 5 to 7 December 2012 at Museum of Natural Sciences of Granollers. Experts in climate change and bioindicators from 20 countries around the world and several collaborators of the Granollers Museum exchanged knowledge with bat scholars from locations as diverse as Australia, the United States, Costa Rica and India during this meeting. They also worked on drafting a publication on bats and bioindicators and on possible future action programmes in this area.

Following the congress, he Museum also hosted the 4th Conference of the Spanish Association for the Conservation and Study of Bats on 8 and 9 December. State projects related to the conservation of chiropterans, the order of mammals to which bats belong, were presented at this conference.



Other events with a major media and economic impact

Within the municipal area, we have part of the Circuit de Catalunya land that hosts several international events throughout the year. Naturally, the most relevant events that attract the biggest number of people are: the MotoGP Championship and the Formula 1 Championship. Both events have a big impact on the city.





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Granollers is a handball city

This is a sport that has given the city an identity and a sense of belonging. Their teams have always performed well in the educational sphere, and they have had several successes both in Spain and abroad competitively. BM Granollers was the first Spanish team to win a European competition.

Granollers is currently the only city in Spain that has seen its first men's and women's teams in the first division.

The city also took part in the Coaliment tournament in May, a tournament involving boys and girls from **all the schools** around the city. Every summer, the Granollers CUP brings together more than 6,000 athletes from all over the world to the city.

We do, however, have an exceptional milestone that we share with only one other city in the world. Granollers has organised the three most important competitions in this sport in the Palau d'Esportes: the Olympic Games, the Men's World Championship and the Women's World Championship. We share this milestone with the German city of Munich.



Thanks to being part of and participating in numerous networks, we also regularly host meetings, assemblies, seminars and congresses.

Granollers is the capital of Vallès Oriental, located in the Congost valley, 25 km from Barcelona.

It has been a strategic and well-connected crossroads since it was first founded. The Via Augusta used to pass through here, connecting Tarraco and Barcino with imperial Rome. This has always made it a particular connectivity hub, and Granollers was actually one of the first towns in the state to have a railway line built in 1854.

The AP-7 highway currently passes through Granollers, which connects the city with the rest of Spain and with Europe, the C-17 highway and several roads that generate a steady network that connects us with the rest of the cities of Catalonia and the major communication axes of the state.

We have two railway lines and three stations that connect us with Barcelona, Girona, Vic, Puigcerdà and France.

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The journey from Granollers by train to Passeig de Gràcia (BCN) takes 28 minutes.

It also has two airports:

EL PRAT airport (BCN) which is 35 minutes by car from Granollers.

GIRONA - Costa Brava airport 40 minutes by car.

Granollers can also be reached by train from EL PRAT airport (BCN) and from GIRONA.

Meanwhile, Sants station in Barcelona is connected to Europe. This will increase considerably in the coming years. This is good news for European attendees who can avail of a wide range of rail routes with a much lower ecological footprint than traveling by plane.

The journey by train takes 35 minutes from Sants station to Granollers.

There are also buses running directly from BCN – Granollers. Some of these buses already use non-fossil fuels. A bus stop is located 3 minutes from the Palau de Congressos.

It is only a 4-minute walk from the train station to the Palau de Congressos.

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Conference participants will have a bus that will pick them up from all the hotels and take them to the Palau de Congressos and return them to the hotel once the activities finish for the day.

All congress participants, with proper accreditation, will be able to use the local urban bus network.

The fleet of these buses is also being transformed in terms of the use of non-fossil fuels. Some of the journeys through the city can be made on foot and we will also offer the option of doing it by bicycle.



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
